Cancellation of Removal

Lawful permanent residents with a conviction can apply if the following applies:

1. Five years lawful permanent residence,
2. Seven years physical presence, and
3. Crime is not an aggravated felony.

Non-lawful permanent residents need to meet the following:

1. Ten years of physical U.S. presence,
2. Good moral character,
3. No inadmissible crimes,
4. Qualifying members who will suffer extreme and unusual hardship.

Adjustment of Status

Non-immigrant aliens can apply for lawful permanent residence if the alien is admissible for permanent residence and an immigration visa is immediately available at the time of applying for adjustment to status. Alien in removal proceedings apply before an immigration judge, while alien previously admitted into the U.S. can apply directly with the Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

Withholding of Removal

Similar to Asylum but requires a significantly greater burden of proof for the alien to demonstrate persecution. A significant benefit to the alien in this category over asylum relief is that the immigration court does not have discretionary control over the granting of the relief as it does over asylum cases.

Asylum

Relief is available to aliens who qualify as a “refugee.” The applicant must demonstrate an inability to return to his/her home country because of past persecution or a well-founded fear of future persecution based upon his/her race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion. However, an alien may be ineligible for asylum, primarily if he/she failed to file an asylum application within the first year of arrival to the U.S. or being convicted of an aggravated felony.

United Nations Convention Against Torture

Similar to withholding of removal in difficulty, but unlike asylum available to aliens that have been convicted of a felony.

Motions to Reopen or Reconsider

Time sensitive request to the Immigration Judge or the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA) to reexamine a decision based on alleged errors of law or facts by introducing new evidence material and not available at the original hearing.

Administrative Appeal

Request review by the BIA of a decision by the Immigration Judge, or by the DHS. Time sensitive in nature and complex in scope.

Judicial Review

More complex than an administrative appeal and also subject to time limitations.
